

## Garden Tips

It's March and the beginning of the Gardening season. To prepare your garden plot for a successful season, it is important that your soil is ready for planting.

- Go through your plot and remove all weeds, dig down and get the root.
- Incorporate compost and good soil into the plot no more than 8 inches. (don't dig too deep, it will activate weed seeds that you don't want.)
- Plants that can go in early are peas, onions, lettuce, arugula, spinach and other greens. Be sure to read the directions on the seed packages.
- It is recommended that you soak your pea seeds in water overnight. It also works for spinach.
- Keep onions away from the peas, they are not compatible.
- You may have to put a cover over the greens to prevent freezing.
- Make a plan for your garden, so that you always have some vegetables growing. And plant some flowers, this will bring the bees and butterflies and keep the bad bugs off of your plants.
